**STATUTORY MEASURE
PROPOSITION A**

Referendum ordered by Petition

Do the people of the state of Missouri want to adopt Senate Bill 19 (“Right –to- Work”) as passed by the general assembly in 2017, which prohibits as a condition of employment the forced membership in a labor organization (union) or forced payments of dues in full or pro-rata (fair-share); make any activity which violates employees’ rights illegal and ineffective; allow legal remedies for anyone injured as a result of another person violating or threatening to violate employees’ rights; and which shall not apply to union agreements entered into before the effective date of Senate Bill 19?

State and local government entities expect no costs or savings.

**SPECIAL SCHOOL LEVY ELECTION
WESTVIEW C-6 SCHOOL DISTRICT,
MISSOURI**

PROPOSITION WESTVIEW

Shall the Board of Education of the Westview C-6 School District, Missouri, be authorized to increase the operating tax levy ceiling by \$0.6800 to \$3.43 per one hundred dollars of assessed valuation and to eliminate fully the Proposition C Sales Tax Rollback in its operating levy under Section 164.013 R.S.Mo. in order to provide additional funds to improve and maintain its

facilities and meet the operating expenses of the District?

(If this proposition is approved, the adjusted operating levy of the District is estimated to increase from \$2.7500, currently, to \$3.43 per one hundred dollars of assessed valuation in tax year 2018 and each year thereafter.)

**SPECIAL ELECTION
CITY OF JOPLIN, MISSOURI
PROPOSITION “A”**

Shall the City of Joplin impose a local use tax at the same rate as the total local sales tax rate, currently two and five eighths percent (2^{5/8}%), provided that if any local sales tax is repealed, reduced, or raised by voter approval, the local use tax rate shall also be repealed, reduced, or raised by the same action? A use tax return shall not be required to be filed by persons whose purchases from out-of-state vendors do not in total exceed two thousand dollars in any calendar year.

CITY OF FAIRVIEW
PROPOSITION A

“Shall the City of Fairview impose a local use tax at the same rate as the total local sales tax rate, currently one percent (1%), provided that if the local sales tax rate is reduced or raised by voter approval, the local use tax rate shall also be reduced or raised by the same action? A use tax return shall not be required to be filed by persons whose purchases from out-of-state vendors do not in total exceed two thousand dollars in any calendar year.”
